The Architectural Committee is comprised of Property Owner's in Lake California that volunteer their time to approve projects that other Property Owner's have submitted for approval. They also meet once a month to review projects (i.e. new constructions, lot combinations, go over new rules, etc..) in the community. They currently meet the 2nd Saturday of every month at 10 am.

An application is required for alterations and additions which includes but not limited to: fences, exterior painting, new windows, siding, landscaping, solar, roofing, and any work done on the outside of your home.

Our main goal is to help home owner's improve their property without being a burden to them. The committee works to keep Lake California healthy, attractive, and safe. A frequently asked question is: "Why do you want to inspect post holes?" Lake California architectural committee requires minimum 24 inches deep and one 60 pound bag of concrete per post due to the strong winds that can topple a fence, especially when the ground is moist. Fences should be good neighbor style with 3 rails. It is recommended that corner and gate posts be 4 x 6 posts to support the gate.

If you are interested in joining the committee and volunteering your time, please come to the office and fill out and application. You do not need to have any experience the Architectural Committee will train you.

After some community discussion, a motion was made to award the bid to J-M Electric based on their **14kw** price.

The View from the Street

This month is a review of the rule regarding **storage**, which is defined in the Merriam-Webster Dictionary as (1): space where you put things when they are not being used, (2): the state of being kept in a place when not being used, (3): the state of being stored somewhere, (4): the act of putting something that is not being used in a place where it is available, where it can be kept safely, etc., (5): the act of storing something.

RR-06-23 STORAGE, states that storage of personal property shall be removed from view of the road, with the exception of:

- 1. Recreational vehicles, which are to be partially defused from view.
- 2. Outdoor furniture.
- 3. Motor vehicles currently registered with DMV and current POA vehicle decal.
- 4. All vehicles stored within Lake California shall be currently registered through the Department of Motor Vehicles.
- 5. All vehicle covers used in off-street parking spaces must be of a commercial manufacture and shall, (1) be of a subdued color that reasonably blends with the surroundings; (2) be fitted, installed, and secured so as to prevent undue sagging and flapping in the wind; and (3) be maintained in good condition.

For the overall aesthetic appearance of the community, the above does not list as an exception things like paddleboats, kayaks, canoes, coolers/ice chests, stacks of lumber or other types of building materials, tools, automotive parts, tires & wheels, yard maintenance equipment, bed frames and mattresses, indoor furniture (which is not sold or intended for use as outdoor furniture), children's toys laying scattered around in front yards, or any other items that are not listed above as an exception.

View from the road (street) means that if the Compliance Officer can see it, take a picture of it, and it is not one of the items listed above in **1 through 5 as an exception**, it should not be there for more than a short period of time. The Compliance Officer will not normally write something up as a violation when it is first noticed but will instead watch to see if a condition remains uncorrected for a few days before a violation notice is sent out.

It is also important to keep in mind that the view isn't from just the street in the front of your property for those who come in the community as prospective buyers and new owner/members, or for those who are guests and visiting the community, it may also include what can be seen from a side street.

Please maintain all portions of your property that may be visible to the public in a clean well-kept and attractive condition that all the residents of Lake California can be proud of.

STARS

Some members of the community have asked what the role of STARS actually is and what do STARS do? First of all, STARS stands for Sheriff's Team of Active Retired Seniors. One does not have to be a retired senior to be a member of the Sheriff's team of STARS, only if they want to participate in the RSVP program, which stands for Retired & Senior Volunteer Program, for which STARS is under their umbrella. STARS is always and actively accepting applications for new recruits. If this is an organization you would like to be a part of and can pass a fingerprint and background investigation, please submit an application to the Sheriff's Department.

STARS volunteers are unpaid members of the Tehama County Sheriff's Office. Their primary role is "extra eyes and ears" for the Sheriff's deputies. While out patrolling in Tehama County, which Lake California is a part of, STARS are in direct contact with the Tehama County Sheriff's dispatch office by radio.

One of STARS primary functions is to perform house watches when residents leave their property for a specified amount of time to check doors, windows and surrounding areas and alert the residents if something is unusual. If a break in of any kind is observed, STARS radio directly to dispatch and a deputy is sent to investigate. House Watch forms can be filled out at the POA office and returned there or filled out online at www.Tehamaso.org. STARS also performs many other duties such as passing out candy to Trick or Treaters in the community and helping with traffic control to assist the fire department and CHP when there is an emergency situation when roads must be blocked. STARS assists with traffic control during the free flu shot clinics in Corning and Red Bluff in November each year. STARS will be providing citizen assists during the LIFT TEHAMA event at the Red Bluff Fairgrounds on November 19th and traffic control for the Red Bluff Christmas parade on November 27th along with numerous other events that happen in the county during the year.

What is CERT? CERT is an all-volunteer organization that trains and drills to assist fellow community members during emergencies. The CERT training program includes basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Our team is also traffic control trained and is hoping to become Firefighter Rehab trained in the coming months.

CERT Equipment is Arriving! Earlier this year, our CERT was awarded grant equipment and material. I am very excited to announce that the small CERT trailer has arrived! The team is getting it organized and stocked with the emergency items we received from our grant. We are working to get the CERT decals on the trailer – so look for it in the community. The larger CERT Command Post is expected to arrive in December.

CERT Monthly Training. For October the team got to see the newly arrived trailer and practiced how to safely setup our new generators to assist with those with medical needs during power outages. The November training will cover some highlights from my 3-day Search and Rescue class, and also check out some of the new equipment that arrived in November.

Recent CERT Events. In November CERT collaborated with Tehama County Sheriff Volunteers (STARS), for traffic control during county flu vaccine clinics. CERT also collaborated with the Lake CA Volunteer fire department to provide fire extinguisher training.

<u>Billing Updates:</u> Metered billings for the period 09/02/21 - 11/02/21 were mailed out on 11/2 and are due and payable by December 6^{th} . Availability lot billings will be going out on December 30^{th} . Payments can be made by check or cash, and credit card payments can be made on our website at <u>www.RAWD.org.</u> Customers can also sign up for auto draft payments by completing the form found on our website or at the District office.

Drought: The state water year begins October 1st every year. As of November 18, 2021 the season to date precipitation was 8.16 inches, with the normal average season to date being 3.69 inches. That puts us 221% above the average, however it is just a drop in the bucket to our existing drought conditions. Shasta Lake level remains at 172.78 feet from the crest, up only 11.70 feet from the level reported last month. In comparison, November of 2020 the lake was 107.75 feet from the crest and in November of 2019, the level was 50.15 feet from the crest. We have a long way to go. Consumption for the period 09/02/21 through 11/02/21 was down 19.8% compared to the same time period in 2013. The year-to-date totals are 17.9% lower than the year-to-date totals in 2013. **All outdoor irrigation should be off now- it will save you money and conserve on water.**

<u>Shut-off valves</u>: Most of the newer homes have a shutoff valve located outside of their meter box which was supplied by the District at the time of meter installation. In our connection standards we highly recommend placing a shutoff valve one foot outside of the meter box. Take a moment to locate your shutoff valves. In the event of a water line break you can prevent a lot of damage by shutting the water off quickly. If you do not have a shutoff valve outside of the meter, we recommend you have one installed. We prefer that customers do not attempt to shut off their water at the meter. A special wrench is required and if done improperly the corp stop can be easily broken. If you have scheduled work to be done, please try to coordinate with the District during working hours and we will secure the water for you.

<u>Tank Rehabilitation</u>: The District has recently signed a contract with Superior Tank Solutions to rehab the interiors of tanks 1A and 2A. If your live on River View near Tank 1A you may experience some construction noise for a period of time and we apologize in advance for this inconvenience. They will do everything possible to minimize this noise.



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

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
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RED HATS
