With 2022 now in our review mirror we look forward to jumping into 2023. We have a new Tehama County Supervisor. Pati Nolan has started her new position and we look forward to working with her, along with the other four Supervisors. Pati has attended several of our board meetings already over the past several months. She is very open minded and is listening to what residents have to say regarding the needs of our community.

RV Lot – Our one-month project turned into 2 and a half months based on the contractor forced to start a little later than planned. Once started we then had days of rain. With the rain we found some sink holes starting that needed to be corrected with additional excavating and rock. Once the repairs were completed, we were forced to wait until the area dried out so the paving could take place. The numbering material that we needed for all the spaces happened to be backordered for several weeks but eventually came in so that portion of the project could be completed. The final process was to get the new keypad and gate motor installed and load in the entry codes into the new system. We have tried very hard to put people in correct spaces based on the lengths of trailers, boats, and RV's that were listed on our spread sheet and contracts. We attempted to make phone calls to anyone we had questions on regarding the length of space they would need. Unfortunately, many tenants have sold their prior property and replaced with larger items without notifying the office. This has made it harder for our staff to then try and find larger spaces for them. For people that have smaller items in larger spaces we may be calling you to move into a smaller space. We have credited your accounts with the time you were not able to use the RV lot (if you had already paid). This was a very large project that was overseen by our Engineers regarding the layout of the spaces, repairs, paving, striping, etc. If you have a concern with the assigned spot, please contact the office so we know there is concern about your space and then can attempt to correct it. Please be patient with us as we try to accommodate everyone's needs. Please keep in mind that tires roll easier on pavement. It is a good idea to put down tire chocks to stop tire movement when we have high winds.

Burning – Once again the Board of Directors approved burning in the community. Burning will be allowed in Lake California by residents on their private property only. No burning shall take place by residents on LCPOA common areas or canyons. Burning may take place from January 1, 2023, through May 1, 2023 (burning could be suspended if needed due to changing weather conditions). Residents that wish to burn, on proper burn days, must obtain a burn permit from Cal-Fire. You may go online to obtain the permit (burnpermit.fire.ca.gov). As of May 2, 2023, burning by residents will not be allowed per rule RR-06-06 Burning. CalFire/Ishi Camp will continue to burn piles in the Canyons that were cut and stacked during prior years.

Culverts – Once again this is the annual reminder for property owners to clean out their culvert underneath their drive way. Every year we have areas of standing water along the roads caused by blockage issues. This is your responsibility to make sure your culvert is clear. Please do your part to help us keep as much water flowing in the right direction as possible.

# NOTICE

The Board of Directors has approved burning in Lake California for residents on their private property only. No burning shall take place by residents on LCPOA common areas or greenbelts. Burning may take place from January 1st, 2023 through May 1st, 2023 (burning could be suspended if needed due to changing weather conditions). Residents that wish to burn, on proper burn days, must obtain a burn permit from Cal-Fire. You may go online to obtain the permit (burnpermit.fire.ca.gov). As of May 2nd, 2023 burning will not be allowed by residents per rule RR-06-06 Burning.



#### The following are burning permit requirements: For burning debris in small 4-feet x 4-feet piles:

- Maximum pile size 4 foot in diameter.
- Clear all flammable material and vegetation within 10-feet of the outer edge of pile.
- Keep a water supply close to the burning site.
- · An adult should be in attendance with a shovel until the fire is out.
- No burning shall be undertaken unless weather conditions (particularly wind) are such that burning can be considered safe.



No household trash or garbage can be burned outdoors at residences. Dry, natural vegetation, grown on the property can still be burned outdoors in open piles, unless prohibited by local ordinances. Burning can only be done on permissive burn days. Burn permits are only valid on "Permissive Burn Days" as determined by the State Air Resources Board or the local Air Pollution Control District (APCD).

Violations Of Any Burning Permit Terms Are A Violation Of State Law (Public Resources Code 4421, 4422, 4423 And 4425)

## **Holiday Tree Removal**

December 29th - January 31st.

This year you will have 2 options to get rid of your Christmas tree.

1) You can take it to the dumpster that will be located at Booster park next to Goff Hall ** bins are for trees only <u>NO</u> trash **

2) You can cut your tree down to no more than 3 feet bundled sections and set it next to the yard waste container or place it inside the container. They will only be picked up on yard waste days and they need to be bare (i.e. no decorations, tinsel, garland, etc.).

#### The View from the Street

With there being many new property owners and residents that have moved into the community during the past year, we want to remind all residents that while possession and use of "safe & sane" fireworks is allowed in Tehama County for New Year's Eve celebrations, LCPOA community rule & regulation **RR-06-09 FIREWORKS** prohibits the individual use or discharge of any fireworks within the properties of Lake California. Violations of this community rule & regulation are serious and subject to a mandatory enforcement assessment fine starting at \$250.00.

Another reminder is that community rule & regulation **RR-06-12 HOLIDAY DECORATIONS**, requires that all holiday decorations must be removed from the front of the house within 30-days after the applicable holiday. Because we are aware that many enjoy and consider keeping their lights up until after the New Year a part of the holiday season ritual, all lights and other holiday decorations commonly considered Christmas decorations should be removed from front of the property as viewed from the street by no later than January 31, 2021 to avoid receiving a notice from Compliance.

We would also ask, (especially with any discarded packaging from all those Christmas presents) that residents focus their attention on the issue of community rule & regulation **RR-06-23 STORAGE**. The visible accumulation of paper, cardboard boxes, scrap lumber, old indoor furniture or any other items that a reasonable person of average sensibilities would consider to be unsightly clutter and debris when viewed from the street are in violation of RR-06-23 and need to be kept cleaned up and removed from view of the street.

Also with the strong winds that occur in the community during winter storms, we want to remind all property owners to remember to take care their landscaping due to any downed trees, tree limbs, or damaged fencing as required of each property owner by **Article 7.4.1 Maintenance of Lots**.

Please have a Happy New Year celebrating both safely & sanely, and keeping properties maintained in an attractive condition in accordance with the LCPOA Governing Documents.




