Happy New Year Lake California,

By the time this article goes to press, and you begin to read it, we will be in 2024. Happy New Year! We will be having our annual Crab Feed again in 2024 scheduled for March 9<sup>th</sup>. It will be held at the Lake Club and guaranteed to be a good time. Fresh crab will be served with the best home-made clam chowder west of the Mississippi. Our auxiliary staff is in the planning stages now. We encourage all our current auxiliary members to attend future meetings. This is our most important fundraiser of the year and truly our "Signature Event." We hope the community will join us March 9<sup>th</sup>.

We have made some incredible progress and accomplishments throughout the 2023 year. It is too early to give the final tally for the number of incidents we ran during 2023 but as of this writing we are 8 incidents away from last year's record-breaking total. We again anticipate breaking last year's call volume. As we move ahead into the New Year, we must ask ourselves, can this volunteer fire department sustain this tempo of running more than one call per day? Are you satisfied with the current situation and happy with the current response times. Would you rather our local volunteer fire department get paid or continue being volunteers? We believe it is time to strategize ways to acquire funding for paid staff at Lake California. We will continue to push forward and purchase state-of-the-art equipment to provide our communities with the best possible care while giving our volunteers the best equipment to accomplish the task. We would like to thank our community members who donate and support our fundraisers.

Do you ever ask yourself, who are our local volunteers? This year we will begin to profile our local volunteer fire department members in our monthly newsletter. You will be surprised to know just who we are and why we do it. We hope you will come and join us.

We need the help of the community to keep this organization moving in a positive direction. Firefighting volunteers are needed, and you cannot do anything better for your community when you become a volunteer firefighter. If being a volunteer firefighter is not for you perhaps you can join our auxiliary staff. These folks are the backbone of our organization keeping the fundraising effort going and supporting us with logistical support. Make your New Year's resolution now and join our organization in 2024!

This past year we strived to educate the public on the use of fire extinguishers and being fire safe in the home. Good job to those who were able to attend the exercises. Wintertime is here and at this time of year the wood stoves are used along with home heating and fire places. Do you have a fire extinguisher, and do you know how to use it? Is your chimney or flu clean and inspected before you use it? Are your smoke alarms working and do they have fresh batteries? How about a working CO detector? Let this stand as a gentle reminder to our community members to accomplish those tasks.

Burning is now allowed in Lake California, it started January 1, 2024. All community members must have a burn permit issued online at burnpermit.fire.ca.gov. Burning will only be permitted on declared burn days. Burning will be allowed until May 15<sup>th</sup> unless the Board of Directors or Cal Fire closes it earlier. All burning is in accordance with Cal Fire regulations and your burn permit stipulations. Being able to burn piles in Lake California is a privilege we do not want to lose.

Our Community CERT has acquired funding for radio equipment through the grant process. Communications equipment has been purchased and will be installed in the two CERT trailers with emphasis to communicate during large scale power outages and natural disasters. We will be helping to conduct future HAM radio classes to have more Amateur radio technicians on the team. Our CERT folks are always looking for new members. In accordance with Proposition 218, the District will be holding a <u>Public Hearing</u> on Proposed Rate Increases and the 10 year Capital Plan <u>on January 17, 2024 at 6:30 p.m</u>.

<u>Wastewater Treatment Plant Updates</u>: The District would like to remind customers **not to flush anything down the toilet other than human waste and toilet paper.** This includes feminine hygiene products, diapers, paper towels, the new toilet cleaning (flushable) pads and baby wipes (<u>even if they state they are biodegradable</u>). Fats and oils from cooking should never be disposed of through home plumbing systems. These items can cause costly lateral plugs for the homeowner as well as serious plugs and mechanical failures at our lift stations and wastewater treatment plant.

<u>Wrap your outdoor exposed pipes:</u> Wrapping pipes can be done with fabric/towels, cardboard, newspapers, insulated pipe form, or electrical heat tracing wire. Allow a small trickle of water to run overnight to keep pipes from freezing. The cost of extra water is low compared to the cost of repairing a broken pipe.

**Billing Updates:** In accordance with SB998, unpaid billings for the period **9/3/23** through **11/3/23** will become subject to **lock-offs** scheduled for **February 6, 2024**. New billings for the period 11/3/23 through 01/3/24 will be mailed out on 01/3/24 and will be due on or before February 7th to avoid delinquent charges. Availability lot billings for the period 10/1/23 through 12/31/23 will be mailed out on December 29, 2023. Payments can be made by check or cash, and credit card payments can be made on our website at <u>www.RAWD.org.</u> If paying in person remember to bring your billing stub with you for quick and accurate posting to your account. <u>If you pay using auto bill pay through your bank, be advised that they issue a check to Rio Alto which can take over 10 days to be received by the District. With this in mind, please allow adequate days to avoid a delinquent charge. Customers can also sign up for auto draft payments by completing the form found on our website or at the District office. This service is free and will ensure payment is received before delinquent charges are assessed.</u>

### The View from the Street

With there being many new property owners and residents that have moved into the community during the past year, we want to remind all residents that while possession and use of "safe & sane" fireworks is allowed in Tehama County for New Year's Eve celebrations, LCPOA community rule & regulation **RR-06-09 FIRE-WORKS** prohibits the individual use or discharge of any fireworks within the properties of Lake California. Violations of this community rule & regulation are serious and subject to a mandatory enforcement assessment fine starting at \$250.00.

Another reminder is that community rule & regulation **RR-06-12 HOLIDAY DECORATIONS**, requires that all holiday decorations must be removed from the front of the house within 30-days after the applicable holiday. Because we are aware that many enjoy and consider keeping their lights up until after the New Year a part of the holiday season ritual, all lights and other holiday decorations commonly considered Christmas decorations should be removed from front of the property as viewed from the street by no later than January 31, 2021 to avoid receiving a notice from Compliance.

We would also ask, (especially with any discarded packaging from all those Christmas presents) that residents focus their attention on the issue of community rule & regulation **RR-06-23 STORAGE**. The visible accumulation of paper, cardboard boxes, scrap lumber, old indoor furniture or any other items that a reasonable person of average sensibilities would consider to be unsightly clutter and debris when viewed from the street are in violation of RR-06-23 and need to be kept cleaned up and removed from view of the street.

Also with the strong winds that occur in the community during winter storms, we want to remind all property owners to remember to take care their landscaping due to any downed trees, tree limbs, or damaged fencing as required of each property owner by **Article 7.4.1 Maintenance of Lots**.

Please have a Happy New Year celebrating both safely & sanely, and keeping properties maintained in an attractive condition in accordance with the LCPOA Governing Documents.





### **DID YOU KNOW:**

What happens to excess food from grocery stores after it reaches its expiration date?

Most grocers regularly rotate their stock to remove expired food products from their inventory. And the food industry widely acknowledges that returning unwanted goods to their original vendors is an effective strategy for managing discarded and expired food.

In contrast, the owners of Nu-Way Market—Beau Perkins, and Bill Patchen, who have been operating the store since 2004—use a more socially conscious approach to handling food waste.

"We work with the Spirit of Life Church to donate our non-perishable overstock or closeout food items to needy Tehama County residents," says Nu-Way Market manager Beau Perkins, "and we give our produce trimmings to local farmers."

For 20 years, Nu-Way Market has also collaborated with the Los Molinos and Cone Community United Methodist Churches to administer the Food for the Hungry Program. Overall, local churches help provide food to disadvantaged families in the Los Molinos, Tehama, Gerber and Vina regions. This partnership addresses the incidence of food insecurity primarily in Tehama County, while curbing landfill food waste and reducing the negative impacts of climate change. Nu-Way Market and its partners work diligently to supply food to underserved families in Los Molinos communities. This results in decreased food waste sent to landfills and reduced greenhouse gas emissions that contribute to air pollution.

"...we encourage all Los Molinos small businesses to partner with us to address climate change by reducing food waste and building (sustainable) food systems for current and future generations," says Perkins.



The Board of Directors has approved burning in Lake California for residents on their private property only. No burning shall take place by residents on LCPOA common areas or greenbelts. Burning may take place from January 1st, 2024 through May 15th, 2024 (burning could be suspended if needed due to changing weather conditions). Residents that wish to burn, on proper burn days, must obtain a burn permit from Cal Fire. You may go online to obtain the permit (burnpermit.fire.ca.gov). As of May 16th, 2024 burning will not be allowed by residents per rule RR-06-06 Burning.




### **Debris Burning**

### The following are burning permit requirements:

For burning debris in small 4-feet x 4-feet piles:

- Maximum pile size 4 foot in diameter.
- Clear all flammable material and vegetation within 10-feet of the outer edge of pile.
- Keep a water supply close to the burning site.
- · An adult should be in attendance with a shovel until the fire is out.
- No burning shall be undertaken unless weather conditions (particularly wind) are such that burning can be considered safe.



No household trash or garbage can be burned outdoors at residences. Dry, natural vegetation, grown on the property can still be burned outdoors in open piles, unless prohibited by local ordinances. Burning can only be done on permissive burn days. Burn permits are only valid on "Permissive Burn Days" as determined by the State Air Resources Board or the local Air Pollution Control District (APCD).

Violations Of Any Burning Permit Terms Are A Violation Of State Law (Public Resources Code 4421, 4422, 4423 And 4425)

### **Holiday Tree Removal**

December 29th - January 31st.

This year you will have 2 options to get rid of your Christmas tree.

1) You can take it to the dumpster that will be located at Booster park next to Goff Hall \*\* bins are for trees only <u>NO</u> trash \*\*

2) You can cut your tree down to no more than 3 feet bundled sections and set it next to the yard waste container or place it inside the container. They will only be picked up on yard waste days and they need to be bare (i.e. no decorations, tinsel, garland, etc.).

## Architectural Committee

"Alterations & Additions" rules for the LC AC. Before you start your project, please make sure you read the LC AC Rules. If you don't have a copy, not a problem, go onto the <u>lakecalifornia.net</u> website, click on either documents or the Architectural tab at the top under RESIDENT RECOURCES. You can look at and read the specific area you are wanting to make some alterations and/or additions to your home. It is the homeowner's responsibility to understand what is permitted and how it needs to be completed, if you have questions, we're here to help you navigate your project.

All of us on the AC committee are volunteers, spending our time to help facilitate your request, because we all want Lake California to maintain its beauty. Once you have researched what you want to do to your home/property, you can go onto the website and download the Architectural Committee and Application form for Additions or Alterations and fill it out. Once you have filled out the form, you can drop it off at the office so your area representative can review and approve your request. Please allow 7 - 14 days for your approval request. Once you have received approval, then you must contact the office to let them know you have completed your project so your area representative can confirm the completion of your project.

It is the homeowner's responsibility to know their property lines, so when you are building a fence or relandscaping your yards you are not encroaching upon your neighbor's property. If you are building a fence, your area rep will need to confirm your post holes before you set them.

Many of the rules in place are because we've learned at LC AC from experience what works, and what doesn't work for our community. The rules are in place to help you, the homeowner on costly repairs or replacement of your requests. Below are some of the **MUST DO's** after submitting your request:

- 1. Read the LC AC Rules and the area that pertains to your project.
- 2. Fill out and submit your request, dropping it off at the LCPOA office.
- 3. Make sure you have approval before you start your project, plan ahead, allow 7 14 days for your area rep to contact you.
- 4. If you want to paint your house, make sure you submit your paint colors to the office BE-FORE painting your home.
- 5. If you are putting in a fence, make sure you call for a post hole inspection prior to setting the fence posts.
- 6. Make sure you can complete your request within the standard 60 days allowed for your project. We understand there are times when this is not feasible, and extensions can be granted on a case by case situation.




 Once you are completed with your project, make sure you call the office so your area rep can inspect your request, insuring it was completed as approved, and it can be closed out in our system.

We all are very fortunate to live is such a beautiful community, let's all take pride in our community and make sure you do your part to follow the guidelines set forth in the LC AC Rules.
