September

Lake – Based on dropping oxygen levels and the continuing heat wave we have pumped our remaining, extremely limited, water allotment this past week. Hopefully, this will be enough to keep the fish going. Our next State water rights contract begins on November 1, 2022, if not curtailed by the State.

Goats - We were fortunate to have the goats come out earlier than thought. They will be working their way through the community for the rest of the month and a good portion of September. If you see trailers set up near where the goats are located, please be aware that the trailers are housing the goat herders so they may keep an eye on the goats. We do not have random trailers just parking where they want. These trailers are authorized to be where they are.

RV Storage – We had hoped to already have started on our paving project by now. Hopefully, the bid for the project will be sent out to vendors shortly by our road engineer and we can continue the process of trying to get the paving and realignment done. As soon as we have more information we will pass it along.

Spike Strip - As in the past, we still have people not obeying our speed limit when crossing the spike strip as they exit the community. Based on recent damage we will now be adding a new speed bump to slow these drivers down and to protect the spike strip investment, which in turns keeps the community safer.

Road Project - Our road paving project is now complete for the year. This year's project went very smoothly. Thank you to all residents living in the project area for their patience and following the guidance of the paving company.

Pool Hours – As the summer nears an end the hours will be changing due to school starting for both our residents and pool attendants. After Labor Day, the pool will be closing at 3:00 PM on Mondays – through Fridays (will be open all day on Labor Day). Weekend hours will remain from 10:AM to 8:00 PM. As of October 3rd, we plan to close the pool for the season.

The View from the Street

As done during the past few summers, the LCPOA Management allowed for the relaxed enforcement of the 48-hour rule related to the parking at homes of boats, travel trailers and other types of recreational equipment, being aware that many residents have had the kids out of school and wanted to take advantage of this time to spend with family and friends using such equipment. Many residents have taken full advantage of this relaxed enforcement period, however now with summer coming to an end it is again time to start parking these types of equipment back in accordance with the <u>LCPOA Rules & Regulations</u>.

Compliance will return to a common practice of addressing any parking issues that are in violation of LCPOA Rules & Regulations RR-06-20 PARKING.

Some residents have a misunderstanding of the rules on parking, they believe that if their eqiupment is being move within a 48 hour period that they can keep the equipment at their home in view from the street and still be in compliance with the rules. This is not correct according to discussions with members on the LCPOA Board of Directors regarding this issue. It is the intent of the "48 hour parking rule" to allow those community members who store their trailers, watercraft, travel trailer, motor home, or other types of recreational equipment at a location away from their residence the time needed to prep their equipment for use, or clean their equipment after use **before returning the equipment to their storage area away from their residence**.

If residents were able to restart the 48-hour period by simply moving a trailer or motor home around the block and then bring it back to be parked at their residence in view from the street, there really wouldn't be the need for having a 48-hour parking rule.

So with the rule intent being made clear, any trailers, boats, motor homes or any other type of recreational equipment continually obsvered parked at a residence, are considered as being <u>stored</u> at the residence and must therefore be stored diffused from view of the street by means of being parked behind a six-foot (6') high Architectural Committee approved fence as stated in **RR-06-20 paragraph** (F). If residents do not have the space to appropriately store the equipment at their residence, then it will be necessary for them to secure storage at a storage facility, and if space is not available at LCPOA storage facility it is the responsibility of the resident to secure storage for their equipment elsewhere.

When parking along roadway easements, parking must be parallel and in the correct flow of traffic as stated in RR-06-20 paragraph (H).

Also, parking on LCPOA property, (such as the open area property at the corner of Lake California Drive & River View Drive across from the airfield) without written authorization from the LCPOA is prohibited. This is covered in the LCPOA Declaration of Restrictions under Article 8.3 USE OF COMMON AREA which states in part that "nothing shall be altered, constructed, placed, kept, stored, parked, planted on, or removed from the Common Area without the prior written consent of the Board."

The reasoning behind parking restrictions is to preserve property values by regulating aesthetics. A number of cases have recognized the authority of controlling "visual blight" within a community. The cases deal with the right to restrict the parking of recreational vehicles, motor homes, trailers, boats, commercial vehicles, inoperable vehicles, and the like. California courts have ruled that ordinances enacted for aesthetic purposes are valid.

Thank you for parking your equipment in accordance with the LCPOA Governing Documents.

Billing Updates: Unpaid metered billings for the period 05/3/22 to 7/5/22 that remain unpaid will be scheduled for lock-off on September 9, 2022. New metered billings for the period 07/05/22 – 9/6/22 will be mailed out on September 7, 2022, and will be due by October 10, 2022, to avoid delinquent charges. Payments can be made by check or cash, and credit card payments can be made on our website at www.RAWD.org. Customers can also sign up for auto draft payments by completing the form found on our website or at the District office.

<u>Drought:</u> The severity of the drought can be seen in the last three years of precipitation and lake levels:

There is growing public concern about local aquifers. This is the 1st year that ACID has not received a substantial allocation from the Bureau and many of the local ranchettes are hurting because of it. They are finding some of the local older wells in the Churn Creek area going dry. Most of these wells are very old shallow wells that are susceptible to droughts and receive some of their recharge from ACID canal percolation. Rio Alto's aquifer remains healthy with levels at 6/30/22 being down approximately 3 feet for Well#5 and 5 feet for Well #6. Static water levels will be taken again at the end of the quarter around Sept 30th. Rio Alto Water District has representation in the Groundwater Commission and we have completed a Groundwater Management Plan for our basin (Bowman Basin) which is currently being reviewed by the Department of Water Resources. Governor Newsom unveiled a 19page document outlining a new strategy for bolstering the state's water supply bullet pointed as follows:

- Increasing desalination plant quantity and production
- Expanding reservoirs and groundwater storage and recycling
- Completing regional water standard efficiencies for houses and businesses
- Streamlining water rights
- Streamlining processes so projects can be planned, built, and permitted more quickly while still preserving the environment.

Still no confirmation on the turf replacement program approval or funding.

<u>Wetlands Update</u>: A new gate for the wetlands is being fabricated to allow for the key card entry. Completion will be within the next few weeks. Once installed, residents will need to complete an agreement stating they will follow the rules and provide a deposit for an access card.

Board Elections: We will be having an election in the November General Election. The candidates are incumbents Craig Weaver and Ginny Mercer and candidate Clay Lowrey.

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

We look forward to seeing you down at the club and thank you for your continued support.




